**80/285. Financing of the activities arising from Security Council resolution
1863 (2009)**

The General Assembly,

Having considered the report of the Secretary-General on the financing of the United Nations Support Office in Somalia¹ and the related report of the Advisory Committee on Administrative and Budgetary Questions,²

Recalling Security Council resolution [1863 \(2009\)](#) of 16 January 2009, in which the Council expressed its intent to establish a United Nations peacekeeping operation in Somalia as a follow-on force to the African Union Mission in Somalia, subject to a further decision of the Council by 1 June 2009, and requested the Secretary-General, in order for the forces of the Mission to be incorporated into a United Nations peacekeeping operation, to provide a United Nations logistical support package to the Mission, including equipment and services,

Recalling also the subsequent resolutions of the Security Council by which the logistical support package for the Mission was extended, the latest of which was resolution [2809 \(2025\)](#) of 23 December 2025, by which the Council extended the logistical support package until 31 December 2026,

Recalling further its resolution [63/275 A](#) of 7 April 2009 on the financing of the activities arising from Security Council resolution [1863 \(2009\)](#) and its subsequent resolutions thereon, the latest of which was resolution [79/312](#) of 30 June 2025,

Reaffirming the general principles underlying the financing of United Nations peacekeeping operations, as stated in its resolutions [1874 \(S-IV\)](#) of 27 June 1963, [3101 \(XXVIII\)](#) of 11 December 1973 and [55/235](#) of 23 December 2000,

Noting with appreciation that voluntary contributions have been made to the United Nations trust fund established to support the African Union Mission in Somalia,

1. *Takes note* of the status of contributions to the United Nations Support Office in Somalia as at 30 April 2026, including the contributions outstanding in the amount of 408.6 million United States dollars, representing some 4.7 per cent of the total assessed contributions, notes with concern that only 102 Member States have paid their assessed contributions in full, and urges all other Member States, in particular those in arrears, to ensure payment of their outstanding assessed contributions;

2. *Endorses* the conclusions and recommendations contained in the report of the Advisory Committee on Administrative and Budgetary Questions, subject to the provisions of the present resolution, and requests the Secretary-General to ensure their full implementation;

3. *Notes* the contingency measures affecting the United Nations Support Office in Somalia due to the liquidity constraints, and requests the Secretary-General to provide information on their impact on mandate implementation by the Support Office and on the operations of the African Union Support and Stabilization Mission in Somalia;

4. *Recalls* that the Board of Auditors identified significant economic losses due to a fuel contractor's non-performance, notes with concern the prolonged delays in the claims recovery process, and requests the Secretary-General to address this issue in a timely manner and to report thereon in the next report;

5. *Recognizes* the role played by the United Nations Support Office in Somalia in providing logistical support to the African Union Support and Stabilization Mission in Somalia to implement its mandate;

6. *Requests* the Secretary-General to ensure the full implementation of the relevant provisions of its resolutions [59/296](#) of 22 June 2005, [60/266](#) of 30 June 2006, [61/276](#) of 29 June 2007, [64/269](#) of 24 June 2010, [65/289](#) of 30 June 2011, [66/264](#) of 21 June 2012, [69/307](#) of 25 June 2015, [70/286](#) of 17 June 2016 and [76/274](#) of 29 June 2022, as well as other relevant resolutions;

Budget performance for the period from 1 July 2024 to 30 June 2025

7. *Takes note* of the budget performance of the Support Office for the period from 1 July 2024 to 30 June 2025;

Budget estimates for the period from 1 July 2026 to 30 June 2027

8. *Decides* to appropriate to the special account for the United Nations Support Office in Somalia the amount of 531,443,700 dollars for the period from 1 July 2026 to 30 June 2027, inclusive of 481,550,400 dollars for the maintenance of the Support Office, 38,862,600 dollars for the support account for peacekeeping operations, 5,771,900 dollars for the United Nations Logistics Base at Brindisi, Italy, and 5,258,800 dollars for the Regional Service Centre in Entebbe, Uganda;

Financing of the appropriation for the period from 1 July 2026 to 30 June 2027

9. *Decides* to apportion among Member States the amount of 265,721,900 dollars for the period from 1 July to 31 December 2026 in accordance with the levels updated in its resolution 79/250 of 24 December 2024, taking into account the scale of assessments for 2026, as set out in its resolution 79/249 of 24 December 2024;

10. *Also decides* that, in accordance with the provisions of its resolution 973 (X) of 15 December 1955, there shall be set off against the apportionment among Member States, as provided for in paragraph 9 above, their respective share in the Tax Equalization Fund of 7,403,400 dollars, comprising the estimated staff assessment income of 5,126,900 dollars approved for the Support Office, the prorated share of 1,656,000 dollars of the estimated staff assessment income approved for the support account, the prorated share of 301,200 dollars of the estimated staff assessment income approved for the United Nations Logistics Base and the prorated share of 319,300 dollars of the estimated staff assessment income approved for the Regional Service Centre;

11. *Further decides* to apportion among Member States the amount of 265,721,800 dollars for the period from 1 January to 30 June 2027, at a monthly rate of 44,286,975 dollars, in accordance with the levels updated in its resolution 79/250, taking into account the scale of assessments for 2027, as set out in its resolution 79/249, subject to a decision of the Security Council to extend the logistical support package;

12. *Decides* that, in accordance with the provisions of its resolution 973 (X), there shall be set off against the apportionment among Member States, as provided for in paragraph 11 above, their respective share in the Tax Equalization Fund of 7,403,400 dollars, comprising the estimated staff assessment income of 5,126,900 dollars approved for the Support Office, the prorated share of 1,656,000 dollars of the estimated staff assessment income approved for the support account, the prorated share of 301,200 dollars of the estimated staff assessment income approved for the United Nations Logistics Base and the prorated share of 319,300 dollars of the estimated staff assessment income approved for the Regional Service Centre;

13. *Also decides* that, for Member States that have fulfilled their financial obligations to the Support Office, there shall be set off against their apportionment, as provided for in paragraphs 9 and 11 above, their respective share of the unencumbered balance backed by cash for the financial period ended 30 June 2025, in the amount of 14,060,100 dollars, comprising the unencumbered balance of the Support Office and the prorated share of the unencumbered balance from the support account for peacekeeping operations, the United Nations Logistics Base and the Regional Service Centre, together with the total other revenue in the amount of 4,851,000 dollars, comprising other revenue in connection with the maintenance of the Support Office and the prorated share of other revenue of the support account for peacekeeping operations, the United Nations Logistics Base and the Regional Service Centre for the financial period ended 30 June 2025, in accordance with the levels updated in its resolution 79/250, taking into account the scale of assessments for 2025, as set out in its resolution 79/249;

14. *Further decides* that, for Member States that have not fulfilled their financial obligations to the Support Office, there shall be set off against their outstanding obligations their respective share of the unencumbered balance backed by cash for the financial period ended 30 June 2025, in the amount of 14,060,100 dollars, together with the total other revenue in the amount of 4,851,000 dollars, in connection with the maintenance of the Support Office and the prorated share of other revenue of the support account for peacekeeping operations, the United Nations

Logistics Base and the Regional Service Centre for the financial period ended 30 June 2025, in accordance with the scheme set out in paragraph 13 above;

15. *Decides* that the increase of 1,378,400 dollars in the estimated staff assessment income in respect of the financial period ended 30 June 2025 shall be added to the credits in the amount of 14,060,100 dollars referred to in paragraphs 13 and 14 above;

16. *Also decides* that the increase in the respective prorated share of the estimated staff assessment income in the amount of 367,000 dollars for the period ended 30 June 2025, comprising the prorated share of the increase in the estimated staff assessment income of the support account for peacekeeping operations, the United Nations Logistics Base and the Regional Service Centre, shall be added to the credits in the total amount of 14,060,100 dollars referred to in paragraphs 13, 14 and 15 above;

17. *Invites* voluntary contributions to the United Nations trust fund established to support the African Union Transition Mission in Somalia;

18. *Decides* to include in the provisional agenda of its eighty-first session the item entitled “Financing of the activities arising from Security Council resolution [1863 \(2009\)](#)”.
